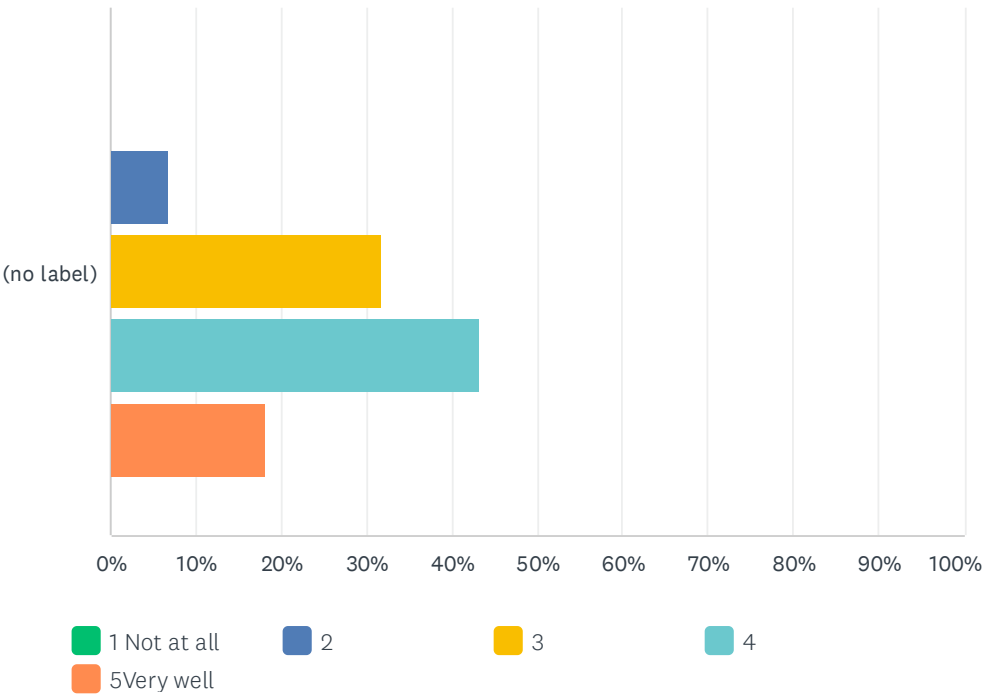

Q6 How confident are you in your knowledge of how to support a carer of person with dementia/cognitive impairment during their stay or in transition to a facility?

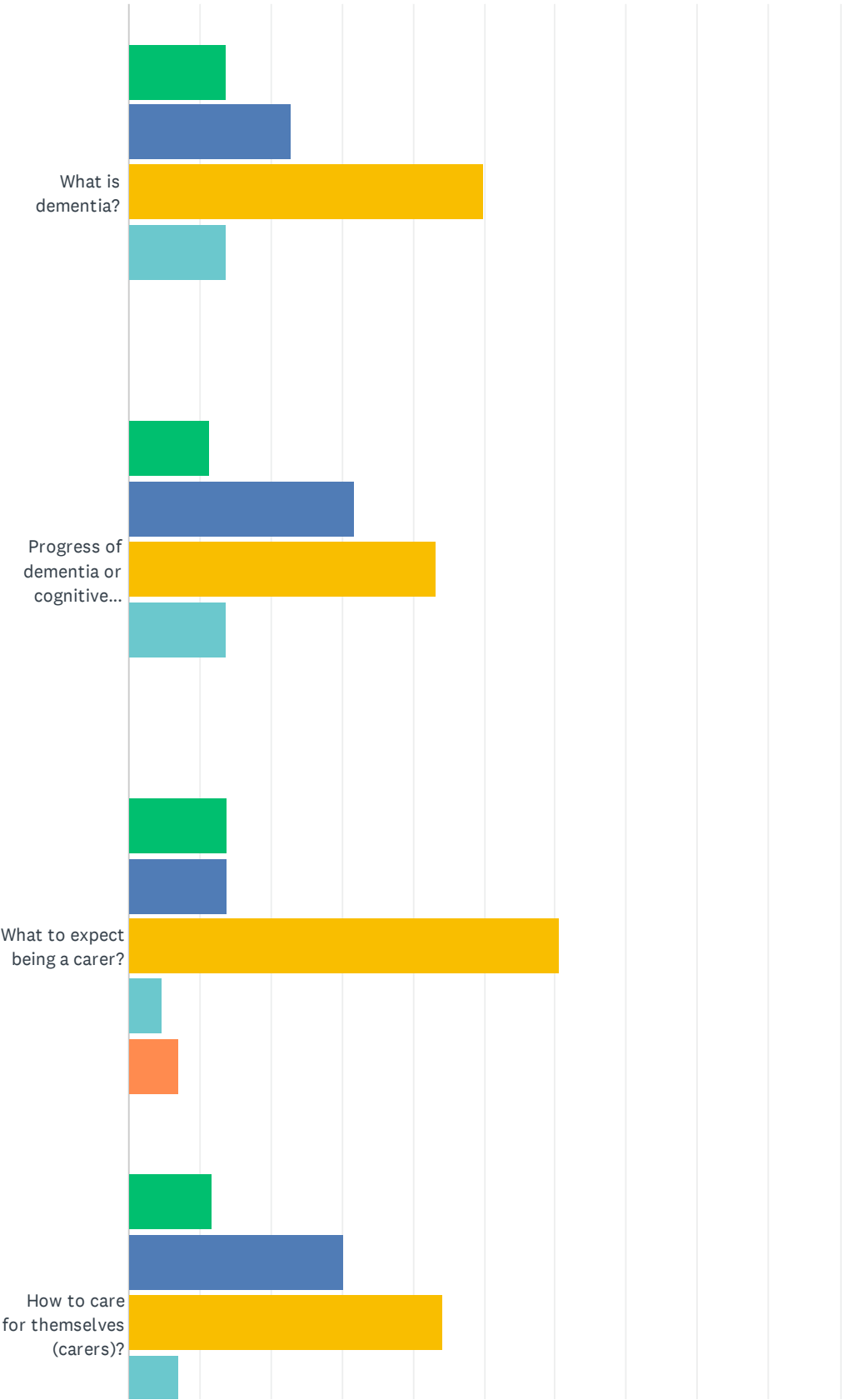

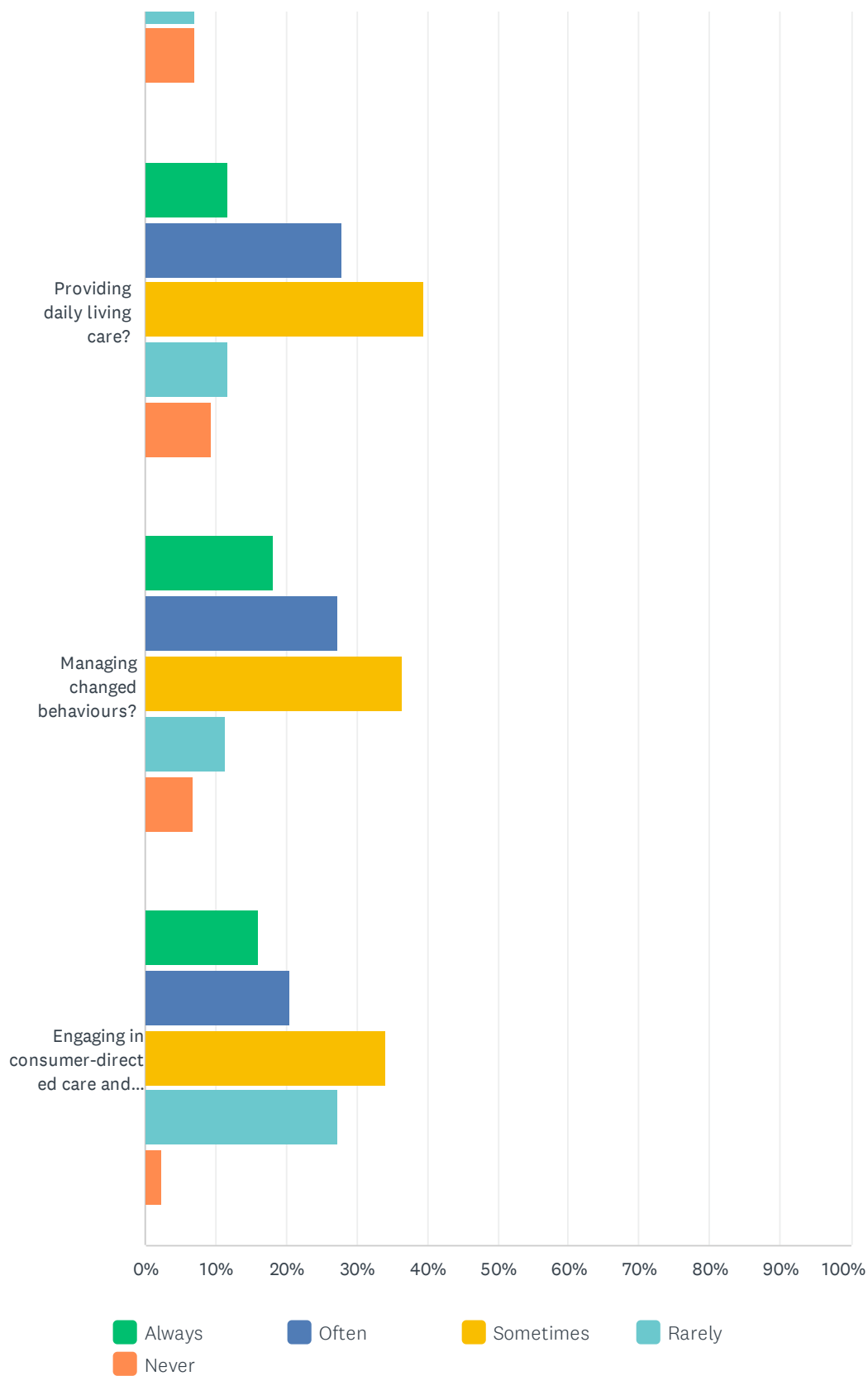

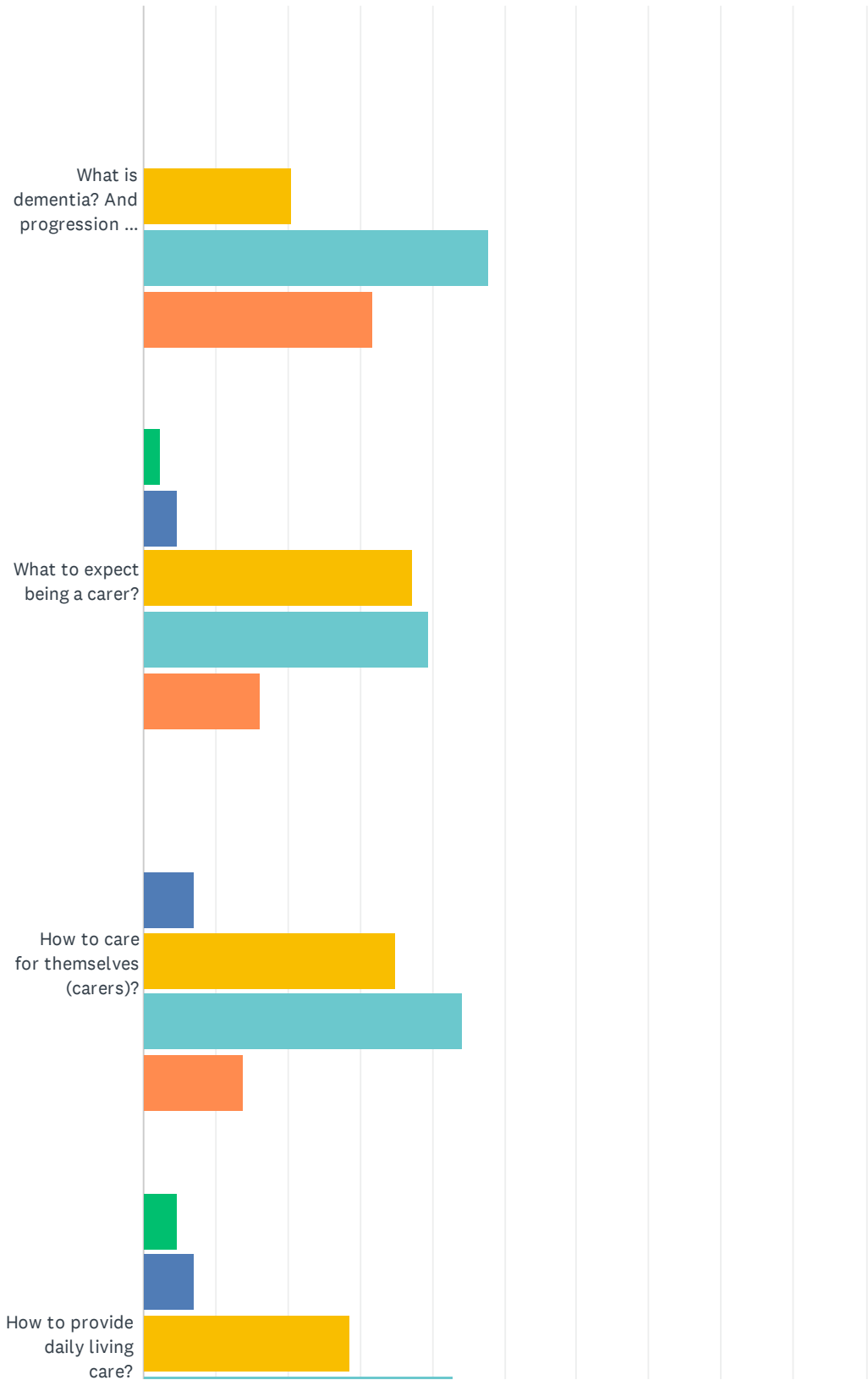

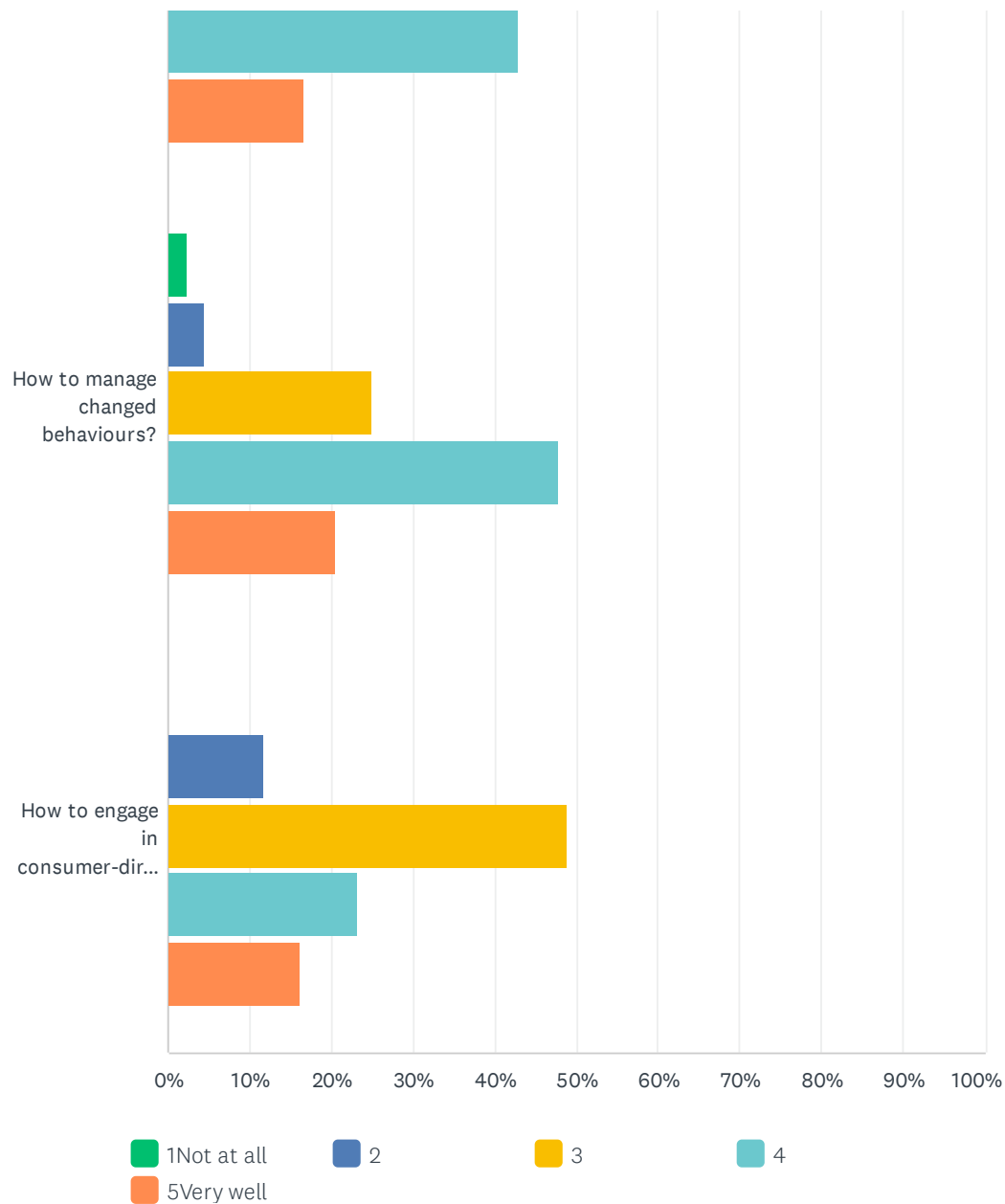

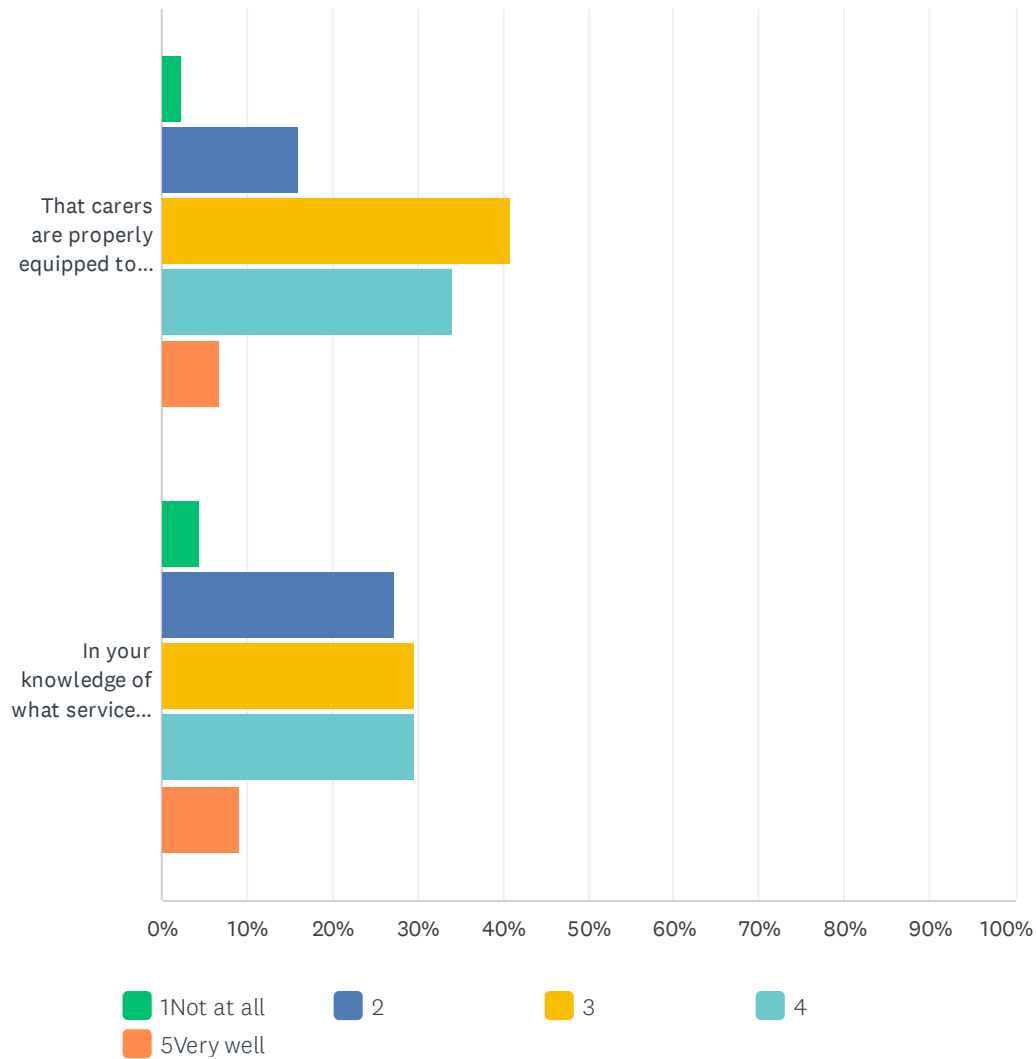

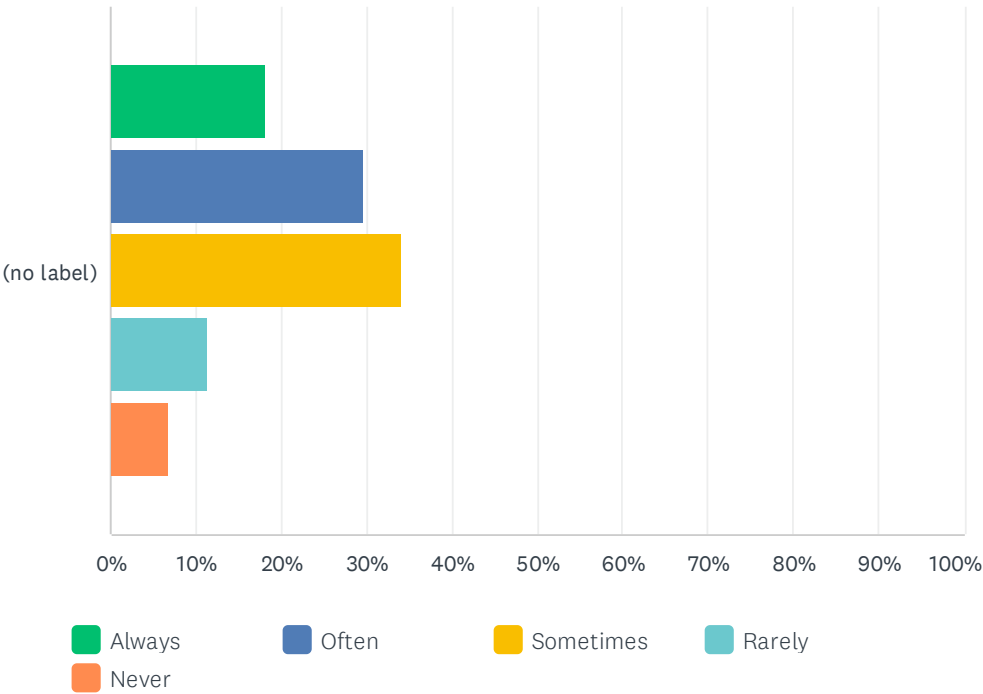
